



The African Circular Economy Alliance ACEA

A transition to a Circular Economy within Africa offers an opportunity for the CE to support economic growth



- A development model for Africa based on circular economy principles offers an opportunity to tackle issues such as poverty, poor infrastructure, and unemployment prevalent within the continent, which have been further exacerbated by the impacts of climate change.
- Circular solutions can also be leveraged upon to attain various climate action obligations and the sustainable development goals



ACEA is a government-led coalition of African nations whose mission is to spur Africa's transition to a circular economy (CE)

Objectives of the ACEA

Policy development

Sharing best practices for the creation of legal and regulatory frameworks supporting the circular economy

Scaling CE businesses and projects

Bringing collaborations within individual or multiple countries for increased financing, designing of circular economy projects and public-private partnerships.

Leadership and advocacy

Advocate for and raise awareness of the circular economy at a national, regional and global levels



Circular Economy Roadmap

Process

- Creates a common vision and direction for the transition to a circular economy
- Brings together key stakeholders from governments, private sector entities, and civil society organizations to drive the transition to a circular economy
- Helps integrate circularity into national development instruments, improve waste management infrastructure, foster stakeholder collaboration, and develop sector-specific policies
- Helps prioritize actions, monitor progress, and achieve sustainable economic growth, environmental preservation, and social development

Document

- Strategic plan that outlines the steps, policies, and actions needed to shift from a linear production model to a circular one
- Guides the identification of investment opportunities and attracts funding for circular economy initiatives
- Serves as a comprehensive guide for adopting circular economy principles and addressing the challenges faced by the participating countries









Business Support Programme for startups in circular economy

- Africa's private sector base is mainly small and medium sized.
- Financing is the main challenge of many circular start-ups and new businesses developing a bankable venture that attracts capital for early-stage financing.
- MSMEs offer vast opportunities for entrepreneurship, which in turn creates employment and green jobs.
- This requires strong support ecosystems on technical capacity building and financial support, especially in the early stages of the entrepreneur journey.
- The programme will aim to offer:
- i) business support services to startups with business models based on circular economy through entrepreneurship hubs (incubators, accelerators, startup service providers); and
- ii) tools related to circular economy developed for the startups and hubs through technical assistance and a coaching programme for selected startups and financing linkages to support their further scale-up.
